


Camp Schedule

The detailed program will be shared with camp participants at a later stage, but here's a preview of what they can look forward to:

The camp's first few days are focused on Indian culture and history. Participants will visit key landmarks in the capital **New Delhi** and visit **Agra**.

Highlights of the journey include the iconic Taj Mahal and Red Fort in Agra, as well as New Delhi's historic sites like Qutub Minar, Humayun's Tomb, and Gurudwara Bangla Sahib. The participants will also get a taste of Chandni Chowk, the old Delhi market considered to be one of the oldest markets of Asia.



During the second week, participants will embark on a journey to the breathtaking hill station of Manali. Nestled at the valley's end, Manali is not only one of Himachal Pradesh's most stunning tourist destinations but also a place of international repute. The town is a paradise of gushing streams, melodious birdsong, dense forests, flourishing orchards, and the majestic sight of snow-capped peaks.

From Manali, we will set off on a five-day trek to Hampta Pass. Rising to an elevation of 14,000 feet, Hampta Pass is one of the most dramatic and unique pass crossings in the Himalayas. On one side lies the lush green Kullu Valley, adorned with dense forests, vibrant meadows, and blooming flowers along the trail. In stark contrast, the other side unveils the arid, rugged terrain of Lahaul, where barren mountains stretch endlessly with little to no vegetation.

Standing atop the pass, the striking difference between these two landscapes unfolds within minutes, offering an unforgettable experience of nature's diverse beauty.
