

ROTARY CLUB GÖD invites you to the 2026 “Sport and Fun” Summer Camp in Hungary

Invitation to Hungary to spend 10 active days at the Danube Bend
nearby Budapest

Basic information

When? The Summer Camp will take place **from 8th to 18th July** with the arrivals and departures on the first and last days respectively.

Where? The base will be in Göd, a small city close to Budapest in the north, at the Danube river.

Who? The Camp accepts a **maximum of 1 girl and 1 boy from each country up to 16 youngsters** from abroad in total. The organizers will strive to accept the enrollment from girls and boys equally.



The participants should be **between 15 and 18** and capable of participating in the programs attached to this invitation letter.

The program contains on **certain days 30 km bicycle riding and half day rowing**. We expect, that the participants are in good physical conditions and can do both. **Knowing how to swim and ride a bicycle is a must!**

The official language of the Camp will be English, so it is expected that participants have a **good understanding of English**.

It is the responsibility of the Sender Rotary Club to send only candidates who fulfill the requirements.

Accommodation: Participants will be hosted at families for some days and in hotels / youth hostels during the bicycle and rowing tour.

Costs: All the program costs, transportation, accommodation, and food will be provided by the organizers. The participants should cover the traveling cost to Budapest and they should pay **€ 450 as a participation fee**. We also recommend bringing some pocket money (around € 100 is suggested).

Arrival and departure: Participants will meet the organizers Rotary Club Göd members at the **Budapest Airport (Liszt Ferenc)** on 8th of July according to the participants' arrival time, and they will travel together to Göd (40-50 minutes drive). At the end of the Camp the Rotary Club members will ensure that the participants get to the airport on 18th of July in time. If participants arrive by other transport methods (train, bus, car), the organizers will also take care of the inbound and departure logistics.

- *Day 8: Row to Verőce (~20 km)*
- *Day 9: Row from Verőce to Göd (~20 km)*
